# Mass League of CHCs: From EHR Use to information Exchange for Community Health

The Massachusetts League of Community Health Centers' partnership with the Mass HIway was highlighted by <u>EHR Intelligence</u> and <u>PR Web</u>. The aim is to leverage the Mass HIway to connect its 49 member sites to enable seamless exchange of data across the spectrum of clinical specialities offered by the member Centers.

By using the Mass HIway to connect member Centers with each other and with other providers, the goal of the Mass League of CHCs is to ease care coordination and improve quality for patients, no matter where they receive care.

#### Mass HIway Regulations Update

Mass HIway regulations are being developed to clarify two sections of MGL Chapter118I:

- Section 7 [Provider must connect]: "All providers in the commonwealth shall implement fully interoperable electronic health records systems that connect to the statewide health information exchange" by January 1, 2017
- Section 11 [Opt-in/opt-out]: "Any plan approved by the executive office .... shall establish a mechanism to allow patients to opt-in to the health information exchange and to opt-out at any time"

It is anticipated that connection requirements will be phased in over a number of years, with the initial focus on hospitals and larger ambulatory practices. Draft regulations are expected to be presented for public comment later this year. The Mass HIway team will keep the community updated.

#### CMS/ONC State Medicaid Letter 2/29

On February 29th, CMS/ONC issued a <u>letter to State Medicaid Directors</u> announcing potential expansion of funding scope for HIEs.

#### What it means:

- With approval, Medicaid HITECH funds can be used to support non- Meaningful Use eligible Medicaid providers to effectively use the HIE if it will help an eligible provider meet Meaningful Use Stage 2/3.
- Supported activities including onboarding to the HIE and HIE architecture and interoperability enhancement.

#### What to know:

- Funds cannot be used to support purchase, implementation, or supplementation of functionality of EHR systems.
- Non eligible providers are still non eligible providers in the Meaningful Use program.
- All activities are subject to prior CMS approval.
- State still has to match funds at 90/10 rate.
- Funding must connect Medicaid providers to EPs and help the EP meet MU Stage 2/3. State must first map specific MU measures to HIE use, and describe activities to support trading partners.
- Benchmarks and implementation metrics must be defined and approved by CMS.
- Process of data reporting must be defined, approved, and implemented.

It is an exciting opportunity that can enhance interoperability, but will take advance planning, and CMS application review and approval.

The Mass HIway is in further review of the opportunity and will keep the community informed.

#### **Provider Directory Update**

Mass HIway is working to improve the process and experience of providers onboarding to the HIE. Part of this includes improvements to updating the provider directory. Currently, participants need to manually update and submit an excel document to start the process of uploading providers into the directory (for more on this, visit: <a href="https://www.masshiwav.net">www.masshiwav.net</a>).

The new process still in development will remove any manual data validation and be all electronic. The Mass HIway will notify participants when this new process is available.
